#### **FOREWORD**

The following general information on the 1974 entering class has been prepared to supplement admissions materials assembled prior to the matriculation of the class. More complete information concerning the law school as a whole may be obtained from the application brochure and University of Virginia School of Law Record.

#### PROFILE OF THE 1974 ENTERING CLASS

The 351 students who entered the first year of law study at the University of Virginia in September, 1974 were selected from a total of 3,890 applicants from 560 different colleges and universities. There were 206 Virginia residents, and the remaining 145 came from 31 different states. Seventy-four of the class were married, and there were 64 women students.

Although widely differing approaches to college grading often serve to render comparative statements about undergraduate records misleading, it is significant that most students in this fall's entering class ranked in the upper 20 percent of their graduating classes. The median grade point average for the entering class was 3.47 on a 4.0 scale. (This computation does not include several students whose grades could not accurately be interpolated to a 4.0 scale.) The median LSAT score was 670. Many of these students also had completed military service or advanced degree work. The average age was 23.3.

The law school has continued its policy of giving preferred status to Virginia applicants, but a large number of highly qualified non-Virginians must be turned away for lack of space. A total of 769 Virginia residents applied for admission, compared with 3,121 out-of-state applicants.
