FOREWORD

The following general information on the 1983 entering class has been prepared to supplement admission materials assembled prior to the matriculation of the class. More complete information concerning the Law School as a whole may be obtained from the application brochure and the University of Virginia School of Law Record.

PROFILE OF THE 1983 ENTERING CLASS

The 381 students who entered the first year of law study at the University of Virginia in August 1983 were selected from a total of 3947 applicants from 546 different colleges and universities. There were 228 Virginia residents, and the remaining 153 came from 35 different states, the District of Columbia, and Guatemala. There were 142 women students and 26 minority students.

Although widely differing approaches to college grading often serve to render comparative statements about undergraduate records misleading, it is significant that most of the students in this fall's entering class ranked in the upper 20 percent of their graduating classes. The median grade-point average for the entering class was 3.55 on a 4.0 scale. The median LSAT performance was at the ninety-second percentile. Many of these students also had completed advanced degree work. The average age was 24.

The Law School has continued its policy of giving preferred status to Virginia applicants, but a large number of highly qualified non-Virginians must be turned away for lack of space. A total of 915 Virginia residents applied for admission, compared with 3032 out-of-state applicants.
