FOREWORD

The following general information on the 1984 entering class has been prepared to supplement admission materials assembled prior to the matriculation of the class. More complete information concerning the Law School as a whole may be obtained from the University of Virginia School of Law publication, "Institutional Information — Application, 1984-85."

PROFILE OF THE 1984 ENTERING CLASS

The 380 students who entered the first year of law study at the University of Virginia in August 1984 were selected from a total of 3454 applicants from 529 different colleges and universities. There were 223 Virginia residents, and the remaining 157 came from 40 different states, the District of Columbia, and India. There were 124 women students and 32 black students.

Although widely differing approaches to college grading often serve to render comparative statements about undergraduate records misleading, it is significant that most of the students in this fall's entering class ranked in the upper 20 percent of their graduating classes. The median grade-point average for the entering class was 3.55 on a 4.0 scale. The median LSAT performance was at the ninety-fourth percentile. Many of these students also had completed advanced degree work. The average age was 23.

The Law School has continued its policy of giving preferred status to Virginia applicants, but a large number of highly qualified non-Virginians must be turned away for lack of space. A total of 797 Virginia residents applied for admission, compared with 2657 out-of-state applicants.
