#### FORWARD

The following general information on the 1987 entering class has been prepared to supplement admission materials prior to the matriculation of the class. More complete information concerning the Law School as a whole may be obtained from the University of Virginia School of Law publication "Institutional Information Application, 1987-88."

#### PROFILE OF THE 1987 ENTERING CLASS

The 393 students who entered the first year of law study at the University of Virginia in August 1987 were selected from a total of 3520 applicants from 531 different colleges and universities. There were 209 Virginia residents, and the remaining 184 came from 32 different states, the District of Columbia, and and Japan. There were 149 women students and 29 black students.

Although widely different approaches to college grading often serve to render comparative statements about undergraduate records misleading, it is significant that most of the students in this fall's entering class ranked in the upper 20 percent of their graduating classes. The median grade-point average for the entering class was 3.56 on a 4.0 scale. The median LSAT performance was 41 (ninety-second percentile). Many of these students also have completed advanced degree work. The average age was 23.

The Law School has continued its policy of giving preferred status to Virginia applicants, but a large number of highly qualified non-Virginians must be turned away for lack of space. A total of 780 Virginia residents applied for admission, compared with 2740 out-of-state applicants.
