### **FORWARD**

The following general information on the 1996 entering class has been prepared to supplement admission materials assembled prior to the matriculation of the class. More complete information concerning the Law School as a whole may be obtained from the University of Virginia School of Law publication "Institutional Information Application, 1996-97."

### PROFILE OF THE 1996 ENTERING CLASS

The 361 students who entered the first year of law study at the University of Virginia in August 1996 were selected from a total of 3,782 applicants from 538 different colleges and universities, 50 states, District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and 22 foreign countries. A total of 1,033 Virginia residents applied for admission compared with 2,749 out-state-applicants. 189 students are from Virginia and the remaining 172 come from 32 different states, the District of Columbia, Canada, Puerto Rico and South Korea. There are 122 women students and 36 minority students.

Although widely different approaches to college grading often serve to render comparative statements about undergraduate records misleading, it is significant that most of the students in this fall's entering class ranked in the upper 20 percent of their graduating class. The median grade-point average for the entering class is 3.7 on a 4.0 scale. The median LSAT performance is 166 (ninety-fifth percentile). Many of these students also have completed advanced degree work. The average age is 25.
