


The 356 students come from 43 states, the District of Columbia and three foreign countries, and attended 150 undergraduate institutions.

JOHN McGLOTHLIN served as a paratrooper and Arabic linguist in the U.S. Army. "Originally I wasn't going to apply to UVA because I wanted to go to school in a big city," he said. "[But] in the post-admissions process, UVA just stood head and shoulders above the other schools I got into. The culture's different. the follow-up is different."

A former reporter, McGlothlin joined the Army after the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks.

"As a journalist, you can influence the news by reporting things that people need to know, and then they might change their behavior. But you're a step removed," he said. "That wasn't good enough for me anymore."

He said he is now turning to law because "it's the foundation that everything's built on."
