1. The Commission on human Rights in its resolution $1952/1^{+}$ of 22 February 1983, <u>inter-alia</u>, requested the Secretary-General to keep the Commission informed every year of the operation of the United Netions Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture. For this purpose, the Secretary-General vishes to draw the attention of the Commission to document $A/38/22^{+}$ cont ining his report to the General Assembly on the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Torture, hich will be a de aveilable to the members of the Commission at the current session. The present note is intended to bring up to date the information contained in the above-mentioned coport of the Secretary-General. The General Assembly at its thirty eighth session adopted resolution 38/92 of 16 December 1983 entitled "United Valuor Voluntary Fund to: Victims of Torture". The text of that resolution is reproduced in the annex to this note.

2. Since the report of the Secretary-General was issued on 23 Povember 1983, further contributions to the Voluntary Fund have been received and the Secretary-General has acted upon the recommendations for grants made by the Board of Trustees at its second session. As at 31 January 1984, the following Governments had made or pledged contributions to the Voluntary Fund:

In addition \$US 28,140 was carried over from the United Lations Frost Funt for Chile and \$US 68,459 in interest has been earned.

General Assembly resolution 38/92 (adopted on 16 December 1983)

United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victums of Torture

The General Assembly,

Recalling article 5 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, hich proclaims that no one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment,

Recalling also the Leclaration on the Protection of All Porsons from Being Subjected to Torture and Other Cruel, Ishuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment,

Recalling turther its resolution 36/(5) of 16 December 1981 in which it noted with deep concern that acts of torture took place in various countries, recognized the need to provide assistance to the victime of torture in a purely humanitarian spirit and established the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victime of Forture,

Convinced that the struggle to eliminate corture includes providing essistance in a humanitarian spirit to the victims and their family members,

Taking note of the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of Forture,

1. Expresses its graticuld an preciation to those Governments and individuals that have already contributed to the United Nations Voluntary Fund for Victims of lorfure;

2. <u>Cells upon all Gevenuments</u>, organizations and individuals in a position to do so to respond favourably to requests for contributions to the Fund:

3. <u>"upresses its appreciation</u> to the board of Trustees of the Fund for the work carried out;

4. Expresses its appreciation to the Secretary-Generil for the support given to the Board of Frustees;

5. <u>Requests</u> the secretary-General to make use of all constant possibilities to assist the Board of Trustees of the Fund, <u>inter alsa</u> through the preparation, production and dissomination of information materials, in its efforts to male the Fund and its humanitarian work better known and in its appeal for contributions.
